


No. 2 Phillips Screwdriver Tip Shown Actual Size




Part Identification





While not all parts are labeled, some of the parts will have a label or an inked letter on the edge to help distinguish similar parts from each other. Use this part identification to help identify similar parts.

| G | GLASS SHELF (3) |




- Assemble your unit on a carpeted floor or on the empty carton to avoid scratching your unit or the floor.
- Fasten the ENDS (A and B) to the BACK (C). Use four BLACK 1-3/8" ALLEN HEAD SCREWS (3) with the ALLEN WRENCH (2).







- Carefully lay your unit on its back.
- Fasten the FRAMES (D and E) to the ENDS (A and B) and BACK (C). Use sixteen BLACK 3/8" MACHINE SCREWS (4) through the tabs on the ENDS and BACK and into the holes in the FRAMES.
- NOTE: You may want to start each SCREW a few turns before completely tightening any of them.



Carefully stand your unit upright.

Stick a BUMPER (1) onto each tab on the FRAMES (D and E).






A Caution


Tempered safety glass is used. It is stronger than normal glass, and it will not break into long, sharp, knife-like shards. However, safety glass *can break*. When safety glass breaks, it instantly fractures into small, bead-like pieces. These small pieces may have sharp edges.

For your safety, follow these precautions when you assemble your product:

- Wear safety glasses or other eye protection.
- Do not try to drill into or cut safety glass. It will instantly break into small pieces.
- Do not force the glass into position.
- If the glass breaks, be careful when you pick up the pieces. They may have sharp edges.
- Carefully place the GLASS SHELVES (F and G) onto the tabs on the FRAMES (D and E).



- We recommend using the FURNITURE TIPPING RESTRAINT KIT (99) for added stability. Fasten a bracket to the back edge of the BACK (C) using the 5/8" screw as shown.
- **▼** Place your unit in its final location against a wall.
- Follow the instructions included in the KIT to fasten your unit to the wall.
- NOTE: Please read the back pages of the instruction booklet for important safety information.
- This completes assembly. Clean with your favorite furniture polish or a damp cloth. Wipe dry.



▲ WARNING

Please use your furniture correctly and safely. Improper use can cause safety hazards, or damage to your furniture or household items. Carefully read the following chart.

| Look out for: | What can happen: | How to avoid the problem: |

| Overloaded shelves. Improper loading can cause the product to be top-heavy. | Risk of injury.Top-heavy furniture can tip over.Overloaded shelves can break. | Never exceed the weight limits shown in the instructions. Work from bottom to top when loading shelves. Place the heavier items on the lower shelves. |
| Improperly moving furniture that is not designed and equipped with casters. | Furniture can tip over or break if improperly moved. Physical injury. Furniture can be very heavy. | Unload shelves from top to bottom before moving the furniture. Do not push furniture, especially on a carpeted floor. Have a friend help you lift the item and set it in place. This unit must be positioned against a wall. |
| Children climbing on the shelves can cause the product to tip. | Risk of injury or death. | Do not allow children to climb on the shelves. Avoid placing items like toys or candy on upper shelves. Use the supplied tipping restraint kit for added stability. |
| Placing TVs on furniture items that are not designed to support a television is hazardous. | • Risk of injury or death. TVs can be very heavy. Plus the weight and location of the picture tube tends to make TVs unbalanced and prone to tipping forward. | This product is not designed to support a television. |
