A minimal to mild degree of fibrosis was noted in 22% of the animals at 4 mg/m <sup>3</sup> , and a mild to moderate degree of fibrosis was observed in 92% of the animals at 16 mg/m <sup>3</sup> . These findings are attributed to "lung overloading", a generic response to excessive amounts of any dust retained in the lung for a prolonged interval.
